Primary Midwife at over 1,500 births

Wallene's journey with midwifery began over 20 years ago, with a hug. After four physician-directed hospital births, she thought she knew all about birth. As she joined a friend planning a home birth for her first visit with Beah, a Certified Nurse-Midwife, she was astonished to see the personal relationship between them—and that the visit began and ended with a hug. During the time of her friend's pregnancy and after her birth, she knew she wanted to offer the same type of care Beah did. That led to a journey of many years, starting with 3 home births of her own, raising 8 children, nursing and midwifery school, then working as a labor and delivery nurse for 7 years. Although she worked for 10 years in a hospital practice, she has never forgotten her dream of working one on one with women in their passage to motherhood. No matter if it is your



first baby or your eighth, every woman deserves a personal relationship with the one who is their guide and "lifeguard" through pregnancy and birth.

When you come to the birth center or she comes to your home for your birth, you will likely find her with knitting needles and a ball of yarn making a hat for your baby. For many years, it has been her practice to give each new baby a hat made by her. Wallene believes that birth has its own process and she has observed that the calm produced by seeing her knit or crochet a hat while waiting helps that process along.

Every day she walks with women through their journey, she is reminded of how strong women are and what miracles are wrought through us. "There is no better job in life than the one I am called to—serving women and partnering with them in the well-being of their family."

Nursing Mom Fights for Workplace Rights

Nicole Counter was thrilled to start working at Amherst Madison Real Estate and Wilson Homes in Boise, Idaho, in 2020. Hired as an executive assistant, Nicole was excited about her future with the company. She hoped to become a real estate agent and felt proud to work at one of Idaho's largest real estate brokerage firms.

A few months before starting, Nicole gave birth to a son, adding to her family of four. She was nervous but excited about being a working mom after several years of staying at home to care for her children, and looked forward to pursuing the career goals she'd placed on hold.

As a breastfeeding mom of an infant, Nicole regularly expressed her breastmilk while she was away from her baby at her full-time job. However, she struggled to find a private location to express her milk. She went from using the company's restroom to a shared office, but other employees still freely entered and left at will.

For Nicole, the lack of privacy was difficult, and expressing milk in a restroom where germs and waste were prevalent was even worse. However, these problems paled in comparison to





Kirsten & Owen's Breastfeeding Story

I've always known that breastfed babies had the healthiest start. My mother breastfed us and my sisters their babies. However, as an acupuncturist and woman, I had heard from countless patients and friends that they were unable to breastfeed for such and such reasons. When I became pregnant I committed myself to breastfeeding my baby no matter what. To prepare

myself, I read books on breastfeeding during pregnancy and even saw a lactation consultant in my second trimester! I thought for sure this meant I'd have an easy time nursing.

Fast forward to 9 weeks into our nursing journey. We have been lucky enough to have been graced by the following obstacles: I hemorrhaged after birth causing a significant delay in milk production. Our baby had a severe tongue and lip tie and was transferring ZERO milk prior to his revision. The latch issues led to blisters and deep bleeding cracks on both nipples. I have



painful vasospasm in my right breast. I came down with full blown mastitis with a 103.6 degree fever and all, quickly followed by thrush!

As much as I like to joke about how unreal my luck has been, it has all made me realize how valuable that commitment I made to him, and myself, was. Had I not been absolutely determined to nurse my baby I would have given up weeks ago. I am fortunate to be surrounded by women who nursed their babies and whose advice is always to keep going. And my husband is so supportive that he took off his second day at a new job to take care of me while I had mastitis.



Today I have plenty of milk to feed my baby and am almost over all of the hurdles. To me breastfeeding isn't just a means to nourish my little one. It's literally his medicine (think antibodies, vitamins, minerals!). It's his comfort, his soother and his favorite place to be. It's hours spent connecting with my baby in a way that was uniquely designed just for us. No matter what inconveniences occur I will continue to show up for my baby in this way. And I'm grateful for the opportunity.
